

TEMPORARY LOCAL RULES

7TH TEE – PROVISIONAL BALL

Having hit from the 7th tee, if there is doubt whether a ball is in, lost in, or playable in, the water hazard, the player may play another ball provisionally under any of the applicable options in Rule 26-1.

If the original ball is found outside the water hazard the player **MUST** continue to play with it.

If the original ball is found in the water hazard the player may either play the original ball as it lies or continue with the ball played provisionally under Rule 26-1.

If the original ball is not found or identified within the five minute search period, the player must continue with the ball played provisionally.

PLUGGED BALL THROUGH THE GREEN may be lifted, cleaned and dropped, without penalty, as near as possible to the spot where it lay but not nearer the hole. The ball when dropped must first strike a part of the course through the green.

GUR - GROUND UNDER REPAIR

Ground under Repair (GUR) is marked with either white paint or white stakes. In addition to those areas identified in the Local Rules, any obvious rut made by a tractor or other equipment, "through the green", may be treated as GUR and relief taken in accordance with Rule 25.

AERATION HOLES ON FAIRWAYS & GREENS

When a ball rests in a core hole, relief may be taken by placing a ball within one putter-head length not nearer the hole.

ARTIFICIALLY SURFACED ROADS OR PATHS, STAKES, GRATES, SPRINKLERS AND WATER HOSES ARE IMMOVABLE OBSTRUCTIONS.

The drainage grate located behind the 9th green is included in the above. Through the green, a drop within one club length of the nearest point of relief, not nearer the hole is permitted.

Relief from staked trees, where the ball lies in a water hazard, may be taken without penalty, by dropping within the hazard in accordance with Rule 24-2, or under penalty of one stroke, under rule 26.

All watering equipment including the spray from watering equipment, is to be treated as an immovable obstruction and relief taken under Rule 24-2.

BUNKER WASHAWAY (Water Damage)

Relief may be taken in accordance with Rule 25.1 (i.e. drop the ball as near as possible in the bunker without penalty, or under penalty of one stroke, outside the bunker, keeping the point where the ball lay directly between the hole and the spot where the ball is dropped.)

STONES IN BUNKERS

Stones in bunkers are moveable obstructions (Rule 24-1 applies).

DISTANCE MEASURING DEVICES

A player may obtain distance information by using a device that measures distance only. If a player uses a distance measuring device that is designed to gauge or measure other conditions that might affect his play (eg gradient, wind speed or temperature) the player is in breach of Rule 14-3, for which the penalty is disqualification, regardless of whether any such additional functions are actually used.

PLAYING SURFACE DAMAGE CAUSED BY BIRDS

Refer definition of abnormal ground condition "hole cast on the course made by a burrowing animal, a reptile or a bird" and relief may be taken in accordance with rule 25.1
