The Flagstaff Hill Golf Club is set in a picturesque area, studded with old gums and surrounded by almost 1,000 modern homes.

The suburb of Flagstaff Hill was developed in the mid-1960's by Hooker Rex Pty Ltd who employed a New South Wales Golf Architect, Mr Bob Green, to choose the best site and prepare the Golf Course.

In 1967 the Golf Club was formed and the Clubhouse built, and Hooker Rex asked a Committee of the day to run the golfing side of the project, giving the Club the right to purchase the property at some time in the future.

This option was taken up in 1978 and the Golf Club now owns the land and the first class Clubhouse. All activities of the Club are being developed and one of the most recent major projects completed was the construction of a water catchment area. This dam not only provides top class water for maintenance of the course, but is also an integral part of the course and has formed what is the most picturesque par 3, 7th hole.

The Golf Course itself has developed into a testing and picturesque par 72 and is fully established with 18 holes of beautifully grassed fairways, tees and greens. Many attractive native shrubs and trees line the fairways, making it a most enjoyable place to play golf.

The large modern Clubhouse that adequately caters for members and guests includes a Members Lounge and a large Dining Room, all of which can be turned into a large convention or entertainment room. Members and the general public are able to take advantage of these facilities, not only on Club social occasions but also for their own private functions, Weddings, Trade Days etc.

Please take the opportunity to inspect our Club and you will agree that such delightful surroundings combined with the cordial atmosphere would make Golf, Social or House Membership at Flagstaff Hill a very enjoyable experience.



Playing Rights

<u>Category 'A'</u>	Have the rights of the course on all days. Women - Have the right to the Tee on Tuesdays until 1.00 pm. Men - Have the right to the Tee on Wednesdays until 3.00 pm.
<u>Category 'B'</u>	Full privileges on the Course from Sunday morning to Friday evening. Women - Have the right to the Tee on Tuesdays until 1.00 pm. Men - Have the right to the Tee on Wednesdays until 3.00 pm.
<u>Category 'C'</u>	Full privileges on the Course from Monday morning to Friday evening. Women - Have the right to the Tee on Tuesdays until 1.00pm. Men - Have the right to the Tee on Wednesdays until 3.00 pm.
<u>Student / Youth</u>	Same playing rights as Category A (Full Member). Available to persons aged 18 to 23 and those persons 23 to 25 years old and full time students.
<u>Junior Member</u>	Available to all persons aged 10 to 18 years. Monday to Friday - Same playing rights as a Restricted 'C' (5 Day). Saturday - 9 Hole Competition at 3.30 pm - No casual golf. Sunday and Public Holidays Tee available from 10.00 am onwards. Earlier times if accompanied by an adult member. Juniors must give way to all categories of Members on the 1st Tee unless they are in an official competition.
<u>9 Hole Restricted</u>	9 holes only on any one day. Mondays, Tuesdays (men after 1.00pm), Wednesdays (only after 3.00pm), Thursdays, Fridays, Saturdays (after 3.30pm) & Sundays (after 2.30pm).
<u>9 Hole Junior</u>	9 holes only on any one day. Mondays, Tuesdays (only after 1.00pm), Wednesdays (only after 3.00pm), Thursdays, Fridays, Saturdays (after 3.30pm) & Sundays (after 2.30pm).
<u>Country Member</u>	Persons residing more than 80km by radius from the Club, are restricted to three months of full playing rights in any one year. Prior permission of the Manager is required before competing in Saturday Competitions.
<u>Twilight</u>	After 3.30pm every day
<u>Winter</u>	Available from 1 st April to 30 th September only. Saturday (after 3.30pm), Sundays (after 10.00am), Mondays, Tuesdays (men after 1.00pm), Wednesdays (men after 9.30am, women after 3.00pm), Thursdays & Fridays.
<u>Summer</u>	Available from 1 st October to 31 st March only. Same playing rights as winter.
<u>Social Member</u>	Have full use of the Clubhouse, and facilities. Pay green fees.
<u>Temporary</u>	Temporary resident in South Australia determined by the Board.
<u>Range</u>	Have full, 7 day access, to all practice facilities, inclusive of the driving range, practice chipping area, putting green and nets. Membership does not include the purchase of driving range balls from the Club Professional. Members own practice balls may be used at limited times on the driving range and at all times on other practice facilities.

**The Board reserves the right to alter these conditions when necessary
i.e. Special Event Days, Social Trade Days.**



Booking Sheets

We have an online booking facility. There are computers available at the club rooms for your convenience if you do not otherwise have access to the internet.

SATURDAY PERMANENT BOOKING SHEET - This is a permanent sheet, with players on the sheet having priority. Members not on the sheet may book morning times AFTER 11.00am and afternoon times AFTER 4.00pm for the following week.

Applications to be placed on the permanent booking sheet are called for twice a year and are advertised on Club Notice Boards.



Club Advantage

Club Advantage is a fantastic initiative devised between Flagstaff and five other clubs. Under this scheme, you are entitled to play at any/all of the other clubs three times per subscription year. No green fees apply, and you can play in the clubs weekly competitions on payment of the comp fee. Participating clubs include, Blackwood, Mt Osmond, Riverside, Tea Tree Gully and The Vines.

Available to Category A, B & C only. (conditions apply)



Etiquette on the Course

- Avoid slow play always keep up with the group in front while making sure that players in front are out of range.
- Call through players if looking for a lost ball or in any difficulty.
- Rake a bunker after use and place rakes in bunkers parallel to the hole (i.e., facing down the fairway away from edge of bunker)
- Repair divot marks and plug marks on greens.
- Carry sand buckets to repair divot marks on fairways and tees.
- Take care with flagstick not to damage greens.
- Leave green immediately after putting out and record scores before hitting off the next tee.
- Take buggies to the side of the green before putting.
- No one should move, talk, stand close or directly behind the ball when a player is about to play a shot.
- Mobile phones may be carried, but be on silent or switched off! Emergency use only.
- DO NOT take buggies or carts across ANY greens or tee blocks



Obtaining a Handicap

You will need a Club handicap to enter and play in Club competitions.

If you do not have a handicap simply submit cards from three stroke rounds, all together, to the office staff. PLEASE pick up on each hole once you have reached 2 over the par of the hole being played (4 over for women). The maximum handicap allowable is 36 for men and 45 for women.

You do not have to play in a competition to submit a card to establish a handicap. The round played does not have to be at the Flagstaff Hill Golf Club. However, your marker must have an official Australian handicap.



Practice Areas

The Club has three practice areas as well as two practice nets.

A practice green located directly in front of the Pro Shop, chipping area and nets near the 1st tee and practice fairway located along side the entrance to the Club.

There are some rules relating to practice on the practice fairway, please check the practice fairway notice board or ask the Pro-Shop Staff for these.



Members Responsibilities

You are invited to bring your guests to use both the Course and Clubhouse facilities.

Whilst at the Club they are your responsibility. Please ensure that your guests are aware of our dress regulations and that green fees are paid prior to commencing play.

In order to maintain subscriptions at a reasonable level, we need to keep our membership numbers up. The best way to do this is for existing members to introduce their family and friends to the Club. In order to assist you in this regard, guest passes are available on request and reduced price green fee vouchers may be purchased from the office staff. The Club offers incentives for the introduction of new members. The current offer is a house levy bonus, the value depending on the category the new member chooses. Please check with the office staff for current bonus amounts.

Dress Regulations

Regulations on the Course

Members and Visitors are expected to dress in a manner that will uphold the dignity of the Club.

- Footwear:** Golf Shoes, without metal spikes, must be worn on the Course and Practice areas. Approved sneakers may be worn with permission from members of the Board of Management or Manager.
- Shirts/Blouses:** Must have collars and the waist tucked in unless tailored with a band to be worn outside trousers, shorts, skirts etc. Singlets, tank tops, tee shirts, sun tops, strapless tops or similar are not permitted on the Course.
- Shorts:** Dress or walk style for males and Bermuda style shorts for Women are permitted on the Course. Sports, gym, boxer or stubby style shorts are not permitted on the Course.
- Socks:** Male Members and visitors are permitted to wear sports socks (predominately white) or long socks with shorts. Long socks are to be pulled up at all times.
- Pants/Slacks:** Must be tailored. Jeans, tracksuits, leisure suits or similar are not permitted on the Course. Trousers and shorts with elasticised or drawstring waists are not acceptable. Trousers are not to be tucked into socks. Plus fours are permitted.

Any clothing sold in the Pro Shop may be worn on the course.

The Pro Shop staff shall have discretion to permit minor variations from the above rules.

NOTE: All pull buggies must be fitted with wide slick tyres.

Regulations in the Clubhouse

In the Clubhouse the minimum standard of dress shall be the same as for the Course. However, clean casual footwear is acceptable. Scuffs and thongs are not considered appropriate footwear. Socks must be worn with closed shoes. Sprigs are only permitted in the Member change room area. Clean, soft spikes may be worn in the Members Lounge and Sprig Bar area.

Dress denim jeans are acceptable in the Clubhouse.

Hats or caps are not to be worn within the Clubhouse.

These standards have been set to allow reasonable comfort to Members and guests, yet maintain the required standards of the Club. **The Board of Management reserves the right to enforce appropriate standards of dress, both on the Course and in the Clubhouse.**



Personal Insurance Plan

As part of your yearly subscription you pay an amount towards PIP insurance.
The details of insurance cover are listed as follows -:

Section 1: Loss or Damage to Equipment

Loss or damage to sporting equipment used to participate in the club's sport. The policy does not include golf balls, tees and other consumables or clothing and eyewear). Sporting equipment does not include motorised vehicles of any kind.

Covered anywhere in Australia.

Limit of cover: \$5000

Excesses:

Section 2: Personal Liability

Insures a members legal liability for an event that occurs while they are on golf club grounds causing:

- Bodily injury or death to someone other than themselves
- Loss or damage to property owned or controlled by someone other than themselves

Limit of cover: \$20,000,000.
(exclusions apply)

Section 3: Personal Injury / Accident

If, as a result of accident on the Club grounds, a member sustains an injury resulting directly in one of the specified events:

Limit of cover:

Death	\$100,000
Temporary total disablement	Up to \$500 income replacement per week for up to 2 years
Other injuries as listed	As defined in the policy
Emergency transport	Up to \$3000

Excesses:

- loss of income - 14 days
- Age limit to 85 years and weekly income earners to 65 years
